1. Background

- 1.1 The premises are a public house located at 84 Leicester Road, Wigston, Leicestershire, LE18 1DR and currently hold a premises licence issued under the Licensing Act 2003. A copy of the Premises Licence is attached as **Appendix 1.**
- 1.2 A map showing the location of the premises is attached as **Appendix 2.**
- 1.3 On 21 December 2018, an application for a review of the Premises Licence was received from a neighbour of the premises, Mr John Lovett. The review application relates to the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance. Full details of the review application are attached at **Appendix 3**.

2. Review - Application Process

- 2.1 The legislation surrounding the processing of an application for a premises licence review is quite clear and has been reiterated by two recent Magistrates' Court cases.
- 2.2 The applicant is responsible for serving the application on all responsible authorities and the licence holder. They should also supply the Licensing Authority with a hard copy of the review application. The Licensing Authority can confirm that the applicant has served the application on the Fire Authorities, Trading Standards Department, Health Authority, and the Borough Council's Health and Safety, Environmental Protection, Planning, Licensing Sections and Home Office Immigration.
- 2.3 The Licensing Authority is responsible for advertising the review application by displaying prominently a Notice at, on or near the premises to which the application relates. It also is required to advertise the application on the Council's website and at the main offices of the Licensing Authority for not less than 28 consecutive days. The required notices were displayed at the premises, on the Council's website and made available to view at the council's Customer Service Centre, Bell Street, Wigston. The Notices were checked by officers during the consultation period and on each occasion were still in situ.

Representations

3.1 No representation has been received from the Premises Licence Holder although a copy of a

- letter written by the solicitors representing JD Wetherspoon to Mr Lovett has been forwarded to the licensing office see **Appendix 5**.
- 3.2 Eight representations have been received from neighbours living in the vicinity of the premises with five of those being in the form of a pre written letter. None of those five offer any evidence and were written to the Licensing Officer pointing this out and giving the signatories the opportunity to resubmit their representation with further evidence but no further correspondence was received. A further representation was received where the intended recipient declined to sign the pre-written letter. Two other representations were submitted with supporting narratives. All representations can be found at **Appendix 4**.
- 3.3 No other representations were received.

4. Statutory guidance

- 4.1 In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is obliged to have regard to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 4.2 Officers consider that paragraphs 1.1 to 1.5, 1.16, 1.17, 2.1 to 2.6, 2.15 to 2.21 and 11.1 to 11.28 may have a bearing upon the application.

5. Statement of Licensing Policy

The Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to its own Statement of Licensing Policy. Officers consider that Parts 3, 9, 24, 25 and 26 may have a bearing upon the application.

6. Observations

- 6.1 The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm.
- 6.2 The Sub-Committee may take such of the following steps, if any, as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) Modify the conditions of the licence;
 - b) Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - c) Remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - d) Suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months; and
 - e) Revoke the licence.
- 6.3 Any determination made by the Sub-Committee shall not come into effect until the end of the period given for appealing against the decision or if the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of.
- 6.4 There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court against the decision of the Sub-Committee by the applicant and the Premises Licence Holder.

Mandatory Conditions under Section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003 where Premises Licence Authorises Supply of Alcohol

- 1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory Conditions under Section 19A of the Licensing Act 2003, as specified by The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 where Premises Licence Authorises Supply of Alcohol

- 1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3) The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 4)(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5) The responsible person shall ensure that-
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The licence holder will ensure that:-

- 1) The premises actively participates and will actively promote premises in any police or local authorities initiatives, is a member of the local Pub Watch group and will adopt any recommendations where appropriate
- 2) A policy has been adopted by the premises licence holder, which deals with its approach to responsible drinks retailing. This policy will be applied as appropriate to the premises and the premises licence holder will work closely with the responsible authorities as to how it should be best implemented. Upon request the policy will always be made available within a reasonable time period, to any responsible authority.
- 3) CCTV will be operated and maintained at all times under the direction of the Crime Prevention Officer. Recordings shall be kept for a minimum of 30 days and made available to the police upon request.
- 4) No unaccompanied children will be allowed on the premises
- 5) Children will vacate the premises by 21:00 hours unless eating, in which case they will be required to vacate by 21:30
- 6) There shall be no change in the "Wetherspoons" concept as placed before the Committee on 21st July 1997
- 7) There shall be no music
- 8) The Committee intend to stipulate a minimum availablilty of seating in relation to the occupancy figures to be supplied by the authorities in due course.

On no more than 12 occasions per calendar year applications may be made for extensions to times for the supply of Alcohol. They may only take place if at least 7 days notice is provided to the Police and Oadby & Wigston Borough Council Licensing Authority, and then only if the Police give their consent.

An additional hour on the morning of the day the clocks go forward (in order to negate the effect of the change from British Summer Time to Greenwich Meantime).

Thank you for your letter dated the 30th November 2018.

I have spoken to the residents of Finson Close about your offer to meet myself and Mrs Newlands. They feel that after 21 years of noise from the above public house, a meeting would be worthless as we have continually complained about the noise and the breach of the licence regulations. We have gone through normal channels to improve the situation AND after all that time NOTHING has changed after promise after promise by yourself and the resident manager. It is obvious that Wetherspoons have NO respect for the License act of 2003 which you signed. Since then Wetherspoons do what they wish to by creating noise from the above if and when they like without any consideration to people living close by in their properties, which has got worse over the years.

We would be pleased to meet you if the application for the beer garden is withdrawn! Then we would feel some progress could be made about our existing problems. I have spoken to Mr Corthorne I understand that you have not provided him with an answer to the questions about the proposed beer garden reference the noise that would be created by the customers also most importantly the smoke that would drift into our homes creating a danger to our health.

One final question for you to answer. Would you or your families like to have this beer garden butting up to your or their boundaries? I would like a reply to my question to the top management that owns J D Wetherspoons.

Human rights are the basic rights and freedoms that belong to every person in the world, from birth until death. They apply regardless of where you are from, what you believe or how you choose to live your life. They can never be taken away.

That's what I thought until I heard of the planning application. The application that Wetherspoons have put into the Oadby & Wigston Council will do exactly that, take away the way we want to live our lives. They want to build a beer garden which will butt up to our boundary. Our bungalow is built up to the boundary. The beer garden will seat approximately 100 to 150 people. The noise from this amount of people will disrupt our lives in our home in Finson Close Wigston. The noise from

the people and the smoking that will happen will drift into our home and others in Finson Close also Victoria Street.

Last December I had open heart surgery, the Consultant from the Glenfield Hospital told me that on NO occasion was I to go into Smoky areas. With people smoking in the beer garden, the smoke will drift into our home would be life-threatening to us.

The noise during the use after the beer garden closes would be unbearable and we will not be able to sleep until the early hours of the morning. My wife and I would like to object to this application, I am 80 years old my wife 73 years old and both disabled. Other people in Finson Close range from 65 years old to 94 years old. Over the last 21 years when Wetherspoons was given the licence in 1997 for the public house, they have breached the licensing laws many times with loud music from the chef's kitchen, and opening the fire doors, with people smoking on the steps outside. The smoke drifts into our bungalow, which is life threatening to me. Also over the 21 years, the Wetherspoons have had the license we have had to put up with the loading of beer barrels at 1.30 am in the early hours of the mornings,. Also arguments outside the rear of the premises. During the summer the fire doors were propped open with chairs and fire extinguishers. I contacted Mr Corthorn one of your officers to look into this. The human rights act says I should live my life the way I choose and this application if passed would not allow me to do that. This is not the COSTA-DEL SOL where they drink and make noise until the early hours of the morning. This is Wigston in a small part of Leicestershire in the U K.

Sir I hope you agree with the above and reject this application so we can live the rest of our lives in peace and quiet.
