The property already has planning permission with 24 hour opening for the purpose of a service station with associated kiosk/store operation.

14. Full Text of Decision on the Application:

At the beginning of the hearing, the Chair explained to the parties the procedure which it proposed to follow.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 ("the 2005 Regulations") stated that the Sub-Committee must allow parties an equal period of time in which to present their evidence. It was agreed that all parties appearing at the hearing would have not longer than 10 minutes to make their representations.

The Sub-Committee gave consideration to the report and appendices (as set out at pages 1-40 of the agenda report pack) which asked it determine whether a Premises Licence was to be granted or refused in respect of the application relating to the Stage Service Station, 282 Leicester Road, Wigston.
