

SAVE OUR EAST STREET CAR PARKING SPACES

Oadby and Wigston Borough Council have put forward new proposals to build flats or a health centre on the East Street car park between East Street itself and Trinity Methodist Church. The proposals are contained in a document called the Brooksby Square Local Development Order.

- The proposals do not make it clear how many car parking spaces would be lost but the part of the car park identified for possible development currently has around 90 spaces. The Council have stressed that they will ensure that any spaces lost are replaced elsewhere in the Oadby Town Centre. However, other than the possibility of providing a decked car park at the Sandhurst Street car park, the Council have so far not said where or how the replacement spaces would be provided.
- The East Street car park currently provides free parking in a convenient location. It is vitally important to the present and future wellbeing of businesses and community buildings in the area as well as to the public who use it.
- The Local Development Order includes a target of 81 new homes to be built in the Town Centre between 2006 and 2026 – this target has already been met so there is no need for any flats on the car park.
- A new health centre is needed but there are better sites available elsewhere (for example, perhaps the former swimming pool site by Ellis Park) – sites which would not involve the loss of car parking at East Street.
- The Council will be looking to approve the Local Development Order at a meeting of the Development Control Committee on 14 April. If approved, it will mean that subject to meeting certain conditions, the precise nature of the flats or health centre to be built will be left in the hands of a private developer. There will be no need for the developer to apply for planning permission and you, the public, will have no say on the detailed design proposed.
