



of fish species we eat found with microplastics in their gastrointestinal tract.




Different species of anchovies found to have consumed microplastics.

IMPACT OF PLASTIC POLLUTION ON MARINE LIFE

- SEABIRDS ingestion of plastic fragments gut impaction, perforated gut
- SPERM WHALES ingestion of plastic litter gastric rupture, death
- PENGUINS- ingestion of plastic litter perforated gut, death

- THERE ARE MORE THAN 600 PLASTIC FREE COMMUNITIES
- PLASTIC FREE ACCREDITATION SCHEME

PLASTIC FREE ACCREDITATION SCHEME

- 1. Local council resolution to support the journey to Plastic Free Community status IN PROGRESS
- At least three single-use plastic items removed from local businesses ar retailers or replaced with sustainable alternatives. NEED HELP
- 3. Engage with other local community groups and get them involved in reducing the use of single use plastics **NEED HELP**
- 4. At least 2 community clean up events organised per year NEED HELP
- Form a local group of stakeholders (must include a council representative and a flagship business employee) to meet at least twice per year to discuss the progress of Plastic Free Communities IN PROGRESS

PLASTIC FREE STATUS

- Plastic Free Certificate
- The Plastic Free 'stamp of approval'
- A locator and feature on the SAS Plastic Free Communities website
- The opportunity to use the official Plastic Free Communities logo on location signs

WHAT HELP IS REQUIRED FROM YOU?

TO ESTABLISH AND BECOME ACTIVE WITHIN ONE OF THE FOLLOWING GROUPS:

- BUSINESS AWARENESS Encouraging local businesses to reduce/ replace items of single use plastic
- COMMUNITY GROUPS engage with groups and encourage them to be involved in reducing their use of single-use plastic
- PUBLICITY AND COMMUNITY EVENTS publicise alternatives to single use plastics and help organise single use plastic events
- PLASTIC CLEAN UP EVENTS help organise two events per year
